- 1) COSESCO permits are valid for one (1) year from the date of issue. If final stabilization is not achieved as defined by the IDNR in their General Permit No. 2, the permit must be renewed. Operating without a valid permit is a violation and will result in a stop work order and associated penalties.
- 2) This permit must be approved prior to any land disturbing activity.
- 3) The controls indicated on the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) must be in place, maintained, and any changes recorded.
- 4) I assume all responsibility for the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and amendments, and certify the SWPPP complies with all requirements of the Construction Site Erosion and Sediment Control (COSESCO) Ordinance.
- 5) I agree to pay all fees associated with this permit.
- 6) By signing this document I certify that all the information submitted above is correct and that I agree to these terms.
